Her eyes light up as she recalls starting at Cornerstone Leadership & Business High School in tenth grade. "It was hard for me at first, to be honest. I came from public school where I didn't have to work that hard and nobody really cared. But when I came to Cornerstone, it was different. I wanted to do better. I pushed myself to get A's."

At Cornerstone, Armani was exposed to several internship and industry options.
