As a result of Harris-Hawthorne's efforts, the story of these important government documents was brought to life.

"I enjoy teaching because I love watching the light bulbs go off every day when students really get something that they didn't understand before. We have so many light bulbs going off in my classroom, we don't need the lights on!" she laughs.

What Advice Would She Give to Someone Considering Cornerstone?
